Atlanta Pianist and Pedagogue, Lusia is high educated professional. She has received her B.A./M.A. from Tambov Musical College, Russia and Donetsk Conservatory. She has finished Postgraduate study from Saratov Conservatory with Ph.D. in Piano Performance and Pedagogy. Her teachers, professors S. Glagolev, V. Khananaev, L. Katz, the winners of International Piano Competitions and representatives of two great Russian Piano schools H. Neihaus and N. Igumnov.

For many years Lusia has been successfully combining her work, as a Pedagogue, with her concert appearances.

Lusia has performed with numerous international symphonies and solo recitals (Russia, Ukrain, Poland, Germany, USA). Lusia's playing style possesses bright individuality, confidence, and courage, and has a palette of senses and sounds.

Lusia's teaching expertise is impressive, as she always works on a high level and has earned the respect of many. Her lessons are interesting as well as substantial. She always plans a curriculum for each individual student, finding the best methods of performing and creative understanding of his/her specific personality and aptitudes.
